

### **Biographical or Historical Note**

The Howell Brothers' Store was a general store in Lebanon, Georgia run by Archibald Howell (no date) and Clark Howell (1811-1882). It was established following the opening of Cherokee lands to white settlement in 1832. Roswell's earliest settlers did business there. The store operated a post office and held accounts for over three hundred families. The Howell Brothers' Store operated between circa 1830-1844 before the brothers sold the venture for stock in the Roswell Manufacturing Company.
