

The Bailey-Johnson School, originally called the Alpharetta Colored School, opened in 1950 on Kimball Bridge Road. The school served local African-American students grades 1-12. After the integration of northern Fulton County schools in 1967, the Bailey-Johnson School became Kimball Bridge Elementary School.
